### **Product Orientation**

This instruction document is designed for all square equal and unequal sided pivot door set installations. The images in this manual depict an equal sided shower. However, if you are installing an unequal sided shower, the steps and methods are the same.

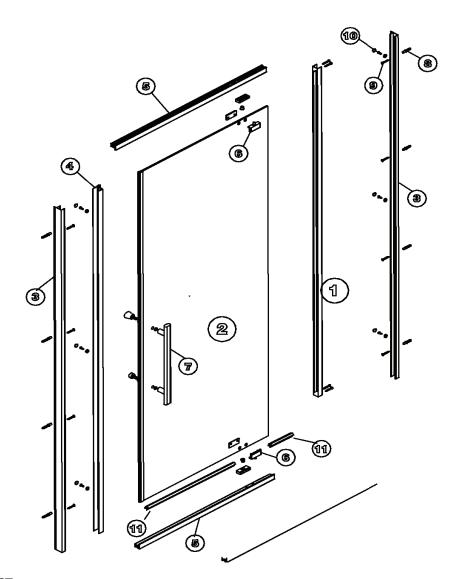
All door sets are reversible, just flip the door over to suit the opening side required.

# Safety / Warnings

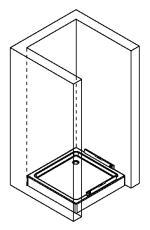
Warning - The Glass Panels of this product are made from high quality Safety Glass. The nature of Safety Glass means that it is highly impact resistant on its FACE (flat side). However, it is sensitive to impact on its edges. Take all possible steps to ensure the edges of the glass panels are protected from impact during installation.

Safety - Please take all possible steps to ensure that the correct Personal Protection Equipment is used, and that care is taken during the installation of this product.

## Installing wall receivers

Before installing the wall receivers, the shower tray and wall liner must be installed in accordance with the separate instruction manual.

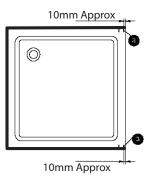

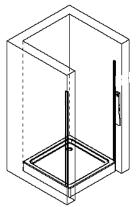
Step 1 - Using a level, ensure the tray is level along all 4 edges prior to channel installation.

IMPORTANT - If you are installing the doorset onto a TILED WALL and an ACRYLIC TRAY, the <u>floor AND wall</u> channels should be installed to the wall substrate PRIOR TO TILING.

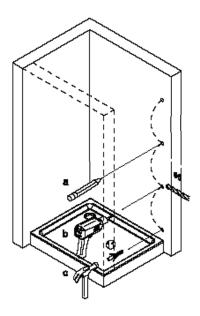
Step 2- Place the wall receiver channels onto the wall and ensure the end of the receiver is touching the tray or floor substrate.

Position the wall receivers approx 10mm
INSIDE of the outer edge of the tray. USING A
LEVEL ENSURE THE WALL RECEIVERS ARE
VERTICALLY PLUMB - Failure to do this will make the door close unevenly and could cause damage to the frame or glass panel.

Mark the position of the wall receivers, and the fixing holes.

Step 3 - Drill 3mm pilot holes.

Step 4 -If the walls are hollow, drill a 6mm hole, and install the hollow wall anchors.

If you have solid timber fixings (preferable), drill a 3mm pilot hole through the wall surface.

Step 5 - ON ONE RECEIVER Install screws through wall receivers and into wall anchors. Run a small "eyebrow" of silicone onto the thread as you insert the screw.

The Second receiver is fitted as a unit with the door.

## Pre-fitting door panel

WARNING - Take care when lifting and installing the glass panels. These panels are safety glass, which is very strong on its face, but its edges are highly sensitive to impact. It is recommended to wear safety glasses, and also use glazing suction tools when lifting and placing the glass into the channels.

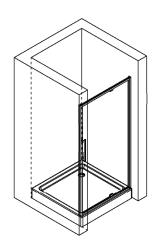
Step 1 - Loosely slide the uninstalled wall receiver onto the door frame.

Step 2 - Fit the Door handle to the glass panel.

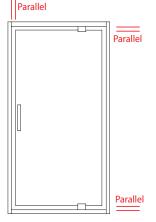
3 Step 3 - Lift the door frame with the wall receiver onto the shower tray.

Gently slide the frame into the wall receiver installed to the wall.

Open the door and from the inside of the shower fit the loose wall receiver to the wall with the fixing screws.

Once fitted the door frame should be held in place with both wall receivers and there should be side-to-side movement to allow for adjustment as per step 4.

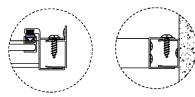

Step 4 - Working from the inside, the door frame can be adjusted from side to side. When the door frame is moved the door will move within the frame. IT IS CRITICAL to adjust the door within the frame so it is horizontally plumb with the frame (as per diagram).

Failure to adjust the door parallel with the frame will cause damage to the door panel and bottom seal.

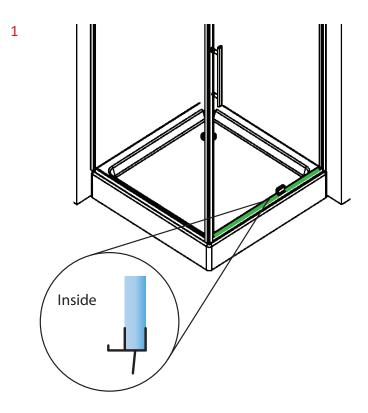


Step 5 - Working from the inside drill pilot holes for the fixing screws at the top and bottom of the wall receivers (leave the centre screws until step 6). Fit 4 x ST4x12 screws and dome retainer collars.

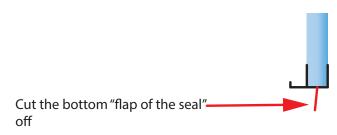
6 Step 6 - Vertical frame adjustment

The door frame's vertical extrusions are flexible, and can be adjusted carefully to ensure the gap between the closing edge of the door and the frame is equal. Adjust the gap, then from the inside drill and fit the remaining  $2\,x$  screws into the wall receivers.

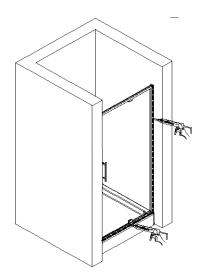

### **Installation Instructions**

#### Step 1 -

Fit the 2 piece bottom door seal onto the bottom of the glass door panel.

Ensure the gutter is on the INSIDE of the shower, and the seal is fitted tightly to the glass.

ADJUSTMENT - If the seal binds with the bottom of the door frame when the door is opened, then the bottom flap of the seal is not required.

The seal can be removed from the door panel. Carefully use a sharp knife to remove the "flap" along the entire length of the seal.

The gap between the door and the framing and the gutter will be sufficient to stop any water exiting this area without the flap in place.

If after removing this flap binding still occurs - the door requires adjustment. To do this you will need to removed the fixing screws between the wall receivers and frame, as per Page 7 #6

#### Step 2 -

Apply a bead of Silicone to the OUTSIDE perimeter of the shower.

Apply a bead to the outside of the wall receivers where they meet the liner / wall surface.

Continue this bead down to the junction of the liner / receiver and tray.

Take care at this junction to ensure the corner joint is completely sealed on the outside. Repeat on the other wall receiver, then run a bead around along the joint between the door frame and tray. Trim and allow to dry for 24 hours.

#### WARNING -

Silicone sealant should only be applied to the OUTSIDE perimeter of the shower. Installing silicone inside the shower can cause blockage of water and leakage, and WILL cause mould build up. Your warranty WILL BE VOID.



### Warranty

All bathroomware products supplied by Fibre Systems carry our Quality Assurance and Product Warranty. We use the highest quality materials available and manufacture these in accordance with New Zealand specifications and requirements to ensure that all products are fit for the intended purpose for which they are designed. Our customers peace of mind is of paramount importance to us.

#### **Warranty Periods**

Showers 10 years
Baths 10 years
Shower Screens and Doors 10 years
Black Coating on Framework 5 years

#### **Warranty Exclusions**

The product must be installed according to the instructions supplied.

The water supply temperature applied to the product must not exceed 55 degrees Celsius.

Commercial applications (where products are installed in a building where occupancy is via a commercial arrangement i.e. rental property, hotel, hostel etc.) are restricted to a 2 year warranty on all products.



### Cleaning

#### **Shower Wall**

We use Durosan premium quality sanitaryware grade Acrylic. It is, by design very robust and chemical resistant. A soft damp cloth with non abrasive cleaners should be used. Use only non abrasive cleaners that are recommended for Acrylic products.

#### **Shower Tray and Bath**

We manufacture our Shower Trays and Baths using a Solid Acrylic Surface. Most other shower trays are manufactured using a veneer Acrylic surface. The great advantage is that small scratches can be removed easily by using fine cutting compound. Again the same basic cleaning methods as the wall are recommended.

#### **Shower Doors and Glass**

All glass is compliant to AS/NZS 2208. We suggest that the glass surfaces are wiped down or Squeegeed following use to remove excess water. For best results use a trusted glass cleaner.

#### Metal framework

Should be cleaned using a soft damp cloth with non abrasive cleaner. Note that on round Showers, the bottom rollers are easy release for ease of cleaning. If chemical spray cleaners are used, avoid direct contact with the rollers and guides and ensure the shower is rinsed off to avoid residue build up.

#### Weather seals and drip strips

Can be removed if required for cleaning, and can be replaced when they no longer look their best Refer to our spare parts and accessories section of this website for more details.

Note - If the Glass has been treated follow specific cleaning instructions from the system provider.
